2 **GENERAL ALLEGATIONS**

3 **A. Identity of the parties and venue.**

4 1. PLAINTIFF JME is now, and at all times herein was, a Delaware Corporation, in
5 good standing and licensed to do business in Los Angeles County, California. JME's corporate
6 headquarters is in the County of Los Angeles, City of Los Angeles. The factual events set forth
7 herein occurred within Los Angeles County, State of California; accordingly, venue is proper in
8 the above-entitled court.

9 2. Defendant MWE is now, and at all times herein was, a business entity, form
10 unknown. PLAINTIFF is informed and believes and thereon allege that this defendant resides in
11 Los Angeles County, California, and has been doing business in Los Angeles County, California.

12 3. The true names or capacities, whether individual, corporate, associate, or otherwise
13 of defendants named in this action as Does 1-100 ("DOES") are unknown to PLAINTIFF, who
14 therefore sues such defendants by such fictitious names. PLAINTIFF will seek leave of this
15 Honorable Court to amend this Complaint when the true names and/or capacities of said
16 defendants have been ascertained. Said fictitiously named defendants are in some manner
17 proximately responsible for the damages suffered by PLAINTIFF herein.

18 **B. Agency allegations.**

19 4. Each of the defendants including the fictitiously named DOE defendants, was the
20 agent, or employee, partner or officer, director or joint venturer of cross-defendants herein, and
21 doing the things herein alleged was acting within the course and scope of said agency,
22 employment, partnership, joint venture, or association and under the direction of, and with the
23 consent and permission, advance knowledge and/or ratification of the other defendants.

24 5. At all times relevant, defendants including the fictitiously named DOE defendants,
25 and each of them, formed and operated under a common plan and agreement, with the resulting
26 injuries and damages to PLAINTIFF arising from acts done in furtherance of the common design.

1 **C. Venue.**

2 6. Venue is proper in Los Angeles County pursuant to California *Code of Civil*
3 *Procedure* section 395(a) because PLAINTIFF entered into a contract with defendants in Los
4 Angeles County; and because defendants were to perform legal services for PLAINTIFF herein
5 in “the *Underlying Action*.”
6

7 **D. “The Case Within The Case.”**

8 7. JME retained McDermott to represent it regarding subpoenas received in 2006 and
9 2007 from the federal, California, and Tennessee governments. The subpoenas sought
10 information regarding the False Claims Act allegations made in *United States ex rel. Hendrix v.*
11 *J-M Manufacturing Co.*, which was then a non-public complaint filed under seal. Each of the
12 subpoenas required JME to produce paper and electronic documents.

13 8. McDermott worked with JME to identify about 160 custodians who likely had
14 responsive electronic information. McDermott then made electronic copies of the custodians’
15 data and transferred the data to a third-party electronic discovery vendor, Stratify. Stratify used a
16 list of keywords to search the data for responsive information. (The keyword list was developed
17 jointly by McDermott and the Assistant United States Attorney working on the matter.)
18 McDermott produced documents containing the keywords to the federal government. The
19 government found a significant number of privileged documents and asked JME (through
20 McDermott) to conduct a privilege review and submit a new production set.

21 9. Pursuant to the government’s request, responsive documents were filtered through
22 a second keyword list to determine if the documents were privileged. Contract attorneys,
23 employed by MWE, reviewed the documents that were identified as potentially privileged and
24 divided them into three categories: responsive but privileged; responsive and not privileged; and,
25 non-responsive. MWE’s Attorneys performed limited spot-checking of the contract attorneys’
26 work, but the firm did not thoroughly review the categorizations or conduct any further privilege
27 review. About 250,000 electronic documents were produced to the governmental entities,

1 including many based on the contract attorneys' assessments of responsiveness and privilege.
2 10. In March 2010, JME retained the law firm of Sheppard Mullin Richter &
3 Hampton, LLP ("Sheppard") to replace McDermott. In or about June 2010, counsel for the real
4 party in interest (the "Relator") informed Sheppard that it had received JME's document
5 production from the federal government. Relator's counsel discovered that some documents
6 appeared to be privileged and segregated those documents. Thereafter, Sheppard asked
7 Relator's counsel to destroy or return the privileged documents. Relator's counsel refused,
8 alleging that JME waived the attorney-client privilege with respect to the subject matter of the
9 documents because MWE twice conducted privilege reviews before producing the documents to
10 the government. JME is informed and believes and thereon alleges that approximately 3,900
11 privileged documents were produced by MWE and that such 3,900 documents should not have
12 been produced by MWE.

13
14 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**
15 **Legal Malpractice against all Defendants.**

16 11. PLAINTIFF refers to and incorporates paragraphs 1 through 10 of this Complaint
17 as though set full herein.

18 12. Defendants owed PLAINTIFF a duty to render legal services competently.
19 Defendants breached that duty by, *inter alia*, producing privileged documents to parties adverse
20 to JME in litigation without obtaining its informed consent, failing to supervise attorneys and
21 vendors MWE contracted with to perform the review and production of documents, and charging
22 JME fees and costs for performance of such work that was not properly performed, or not
23 performed at all.

24 13. PLAINTIFF alleges, upon information and belief, that McDermott failed to inform
25 PLAINTIFF that attorney-client privileged documents and other privileged documents had been
26 disclosed, and further failed to disclose the scope of such release of privileged documents.

27 14. Defendants breach caused JME damages in an amount to be proved according to
28 proof at trial, but in no event less than the jurisdictional minimum of this Court.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION
Breach of Fiduciary Duty against all defendants

15. PLAINTIFF refers to and incorporates paragraphs 1 through 14 of this Complaint as though set full herein.

16. Defendants owed PLAINTIFF a fiduciary duty. Defendants breached that duty by, *inter alia*, producing privileged documents to parties adverse to JME in several lawsuits, failing to supervise attorneys and vendors MWE contracted with to perform the review and production of documents, and charging JME fees and costs for performance of such work that was not properly performed, or not performed at all.

17. Defendants breach caused JME damages in an amount to be proved according to proof at trial, but in no event less than the jurisdictional minimum of this Court.

18. The actions of defendants were (1) fraudulent, meaning an intentional misrepresentation, deceit, or concealment of a material fact known to the defendants with the intention on the part of the defendant of thereby depriving a person of property or legal rights or otherwise causing injury; (2) malicious, meaning conduct which is intended by the defendants to cause injury to the PLAINTIFFs or despicable conduct which is carried on by the defendants with a willful and conscious disregard of the rights or safety of others; (3) and/or oppressive, meaning despicable conduct that subjects a person to cruel and unjust hardship in conscious disregard of that person's rights; and done with the intention of depriving PLAINTIFFs of substantial rights. PLAINTIFFs are therefore entitled to punitive damages in a sufficient amount to make an example of, punish defendants, and deter future fraudulent, oppressive and malicious misconduct in an amount according to proof at trial.

THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION
(Accounting- Against All Defendants)

19. PLAINTIFF refers to and incorporates paragraphs 1 through 18 of this Complaint as though fully set forth herein.

1 20. PLAINTIFF is informed and believes and thereon alleges that Defendants “marked
2 up” fees and costs paid to contract attorneys and vendors and failed to disclose that such fees and
3 costs were being “marked up.” Because Defendants did not have a written contract with JME, or
4 other authority, to “mark up” such fees and costs, such “mark up” was unlawful.

5 21. The amount of the “mark up” is unknown to PLAINTIFF and cannot be
6 ascertained without an accounting of the amounts paid for such contract attorneys and vendors.

7
8 **WHEREFORE**, PLAINTIFF prays for judgment against Defendants, as follows:

9
10 ON THE FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION:

- 11 1. Damages according to proof at trial.

12
13 ON THE SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION:

- 14 1. Damages according to proof at trial.
15 2. Punitive damages in an amount according to proof at trial.

16
17 ON THE THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION:

- 18 1. An accounting of the fees and costs paid to contract attorneys and vendors.

19
20 ON ALL CAUSES OF ACTION:

- 21 1. For costs of suit incurred herein.
22 2. For a reasonable attorneys fee.
23 3. Such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.
